## **Our story**

The Crayon Initiative collects used and unwanted crayons and turns them into bright, clean new art supplies for pediatric patients in over 240 children's hospitals in all 50 states.

#### Our rule of thumb

One free pack of crayons can draw a thousand smiles.

This box contains enough to make 40 new packs of free crayons. That's a lot of good feelings. Nice work!

**Get started.** (This process takes about an hour to complete, and makes a priceless difference for kids.)

Kit Contains:

- USED CRAYONS
- 1 PAIR OF DISPOSABLE GLOVES
- 10 SORTING BAGS

#### **Instructions:**

- **1** Put on gloves, if desired.
- **2** Open all sorting bags. We find rolling the top down helps support the bags.
- **3** Remove and recycle the cardboard partition.
- **4** Sort all crayons by basic color and put them in bags.
- **5** Use one bag for each color. red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple, pink, white, black.
- **6** Use the last bag for "Everything Else" like the colors light brown, silver and grey, and any pieces you can't decide on.
- **7** Squeeze air out of bags and seal.
- **8** Lay full bags in the box and close.

## Tips:

Keep it simple. If a crayon is any shade of blue, it goes in blue. When in doubt, lean toward the darker color. For example, yellow/green goes in green. Use a piece of scrap paper to test colors you're not sure of.
